Directions to Springfield House

Arriving by Car

If you are arriving by car then you will likely be looking to work out how to get from the A35 into Lyme Regis itself. The signposts are good and it's easy to find the town. You can take either B3165 (if you are coming from the west) Or A3052 (if you are coming from the east)

From the East: follow the road, through the centre of town and as you come up the hill and past Tesco, then turn right up Silver Street. Keep going up the hill and until you see Dorset House on the left and the Mariners on the right. If you come to a roundabout then turn back as you have gone too far! Woodmead Road is the tight right turn by the stone wall. You will drive past Springfield House on your right and 50m down Woodmead Road you will see a large car park just past the house.

From the West: If you are coming from the west along the A3052 then you will go through Uplyme and go past Travis Perkins, as you go past Kent House on the left you should be able to see Dorset House ahead on the right. Woodmead road is BEFORE Dorset House on the left, it is a tight turn by the stone wall. You will drive past Springfield House on your right and 50m down Woodmead Road you will see a large car park just past the house. Remember not to park on the driveway but only in the carpark.

Springfield is easy to find as it's well positioned on the way in (or out) of town. Important to note, you are looking for Springfield House NOT Springfield Cottage and the place to park is the large car park for 8 cars at the bottom of the house, not on the driveway to Springfield Cottage!

Hix Oyster and Fish House

Perched only a few minutes walk from the house, overlooking the Cobb. Check out this review from The Sunday Times:

“Hix Oyster & Fish House, Cobb Road, Lyme Regis, Dorset — this must be the most romantic address and breathtaking location of any restaurant in Dorset, or indeed, the whole of England. Yes, it was a day of pearly luminescence, with the spring sun bouncing off plump green hills and sheer cliffs, with seagulls wheeling in the sky and the sea a soft, sheeny blue, and everything looks better in the sunshine. But the restaurant is perched on a steep hill above the Cobb and has a deck like the prow of a ship, complete with prow and flagpole, where you can sit and sip Manzanilla, and slip the sea down your throat while watching the fishing smacks chug in and out, and the toddlers paddle in the strand below. It is impossible not to feel a faint twinge of wellbeing.”

The kids can go wild in the grounds and games room – but if you'd like to go further afield, it's just a stroll to the beaches and harbour where they will love building sandcastles at the beach, searching for crabs in the harbour and hunting for fossils along the Jurassic Coast.

Fossil Hunting and The Jurassic Coast

Explore the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site which tells the story of 185 million years of the Earth's history – a 95 mile stretch from Swanage in the East to Exmouth in the West,

Take a fossil hunting walk and discover the fossilised remains of giant ichthyosaur, plesiosaur, belemnites and ammonites that can be found on the beach.

Top places to visit & shop nearby

At Springfield House you are minutes away from the sea where you can enjoy a family-friendly, sandy beach and an often surprising micro-climate in the shelter of Lyme Bay, but if you can tear yourself away - Lyme Regis is part of the Jurassic Coast World Heritage site and surrounded by areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Lyme Regis, the "Pearl of Dorset", is famous for its fossils, its historic old town, its Cobb and its beaches.....so here are our top recommendations for activities and pampering.

Lyme Regis

The old town, dating back to the 14th century, is an ideal place to walk and explore the local shops, art galleries, newly replanted gardens with myriad places to stop to eat and drink. Built around the River Lym, Lyme has its own working Water Mill, recently refurbished to include an electricity generator. Lyme Regis is very special in that it is probably the smallest town in the country to boast its own cinema, theatre, and museum.

The Cobb attracts visitors not just for its visual splendour and its magnificent naval architecture, but also for its connections with great literature. Indeed, people come from all over the world to see the steps where Louisa Musgrove fell in Jane Austen's *Persuasion*; or to see where Meryl Streep stood, looking forlornly out to sea, in the film adaptation of John Fowles' *The French Lieutenant's Woman*. And art lovers are drawn to Lyme for both its beautiful scenery and for its wide range of art galleries.

Marine Parade is a great place to walk, sit, enjoy the views and visit its small shops and eating places. Here the seafront facilities has benefited from the restoration of the Marine Parade Shelters. The town and surrounding area have many attractions and host a range of family-centred events, including a Jazz Festival, a Fossil Festival, Life Boat Week and a Regatta & Carnival Week.

National Nature Reserve at the Undercliff

Walkers will love to explore the National Nature Reserve at the Undercliff. This seven mile long undeveloped woodland is part of the South West Coastal Path and stretches west towards Axmouth and Seaton. Going east from Lyme, walkers can follow the same path or take the coastal footpath, part of the 650 mile South West Coastal Path, towards Charmouth and to Golden Cap. At 629ft, this is the highest point on the south coast. Other dry land activities abound: golfing, bowling, pony trekking and biking are just a few of the options available.

Shopping in Lyme Regis

Lyme Regis has a wealth of independent shops selling unusual gifts, clothes, books, fossils and antiques, as well as a range of fantastic locally produced food.

You can buy freshly baked pies and pasties; freshly made sandwiches and baguettes; cakes, pastries and fudge; locally grown, organic, whole food; specialist imported foods; and organic fruit and vegetables.

There are gift shops selling souvenirs of Lyme, as well as teddy bears and sweets. Shops specialising in rocks and fossils as well as jewellery can also be found. Lyme has a number of art galleries throughout the town and shops specialising in antiques and collectables.

There are a wealth of clothes shops for children and adults, selling sportswear and surfing gear; outdoor gear; shoes and trainers; hats; bespoke designer dresses and vintage clothing.

The town also has a selection of national chains (Boots, Co-op & Tesco's), three banks and a Post Office and a wide range of local chains and individual local shops.
